Road Safety – Hazardous Parking Outside School

School has received a number of complaints regarding hazardous parking outside school at pick-up and drop-off times, i.e. at the beginning and end of the school day. The particular focus is upon cars parking on the yellow lines outside school.

For the safety of our children, please do not park on the yellow zig-zag lines, as it greatly reduces visibility for anyone trying to cross the road.

We have contacted West Yorkshire Police about this issue and we have received the following response:

"Thank you for your email regarding the dangerous parking outside your school. We as a NPT are aware of the parking problems at all schools in the district. I myself as a PCSO for Pontefract I have issued numerous tickets to parents from your school in the past. As soon as the parents were aware police/pcsos were coming to the school they would park according to the highway code. Your local NPT officer will come up and pay some attention to the parking problems as and when their shifts permit.

With regards to issuing tickets, the police can now only issue them for obstruction. If cars are seen to be parking on ZIG ZAGS or double yellow lines, then it is the local council who deal with that.

If the problem persists when parents are dropping off and picking up their children, it needs to be reported (by phoning 101) <u>at the time the problem is happening</u>. The police will only be able to deal with an obstruction where a vehicle is completely blocked in and cannot get out. I would advise yourselves and parents to contact Wakefield Council to make them aware, as only the Council can legally issue parking tickets for double yellow lines and Zig Zags".

RESPONSIBILITY

It is a parent's responsibility to see their children safely to and from school but, in doing so, they should not create dangers to others.

SCHOOL ENTRANCES

If you travel to school by car, do not stop (even to drop off or pick up) on "School - Keep - Clear" markings. Park well clear of the school entrance. A stationary car can prevent a driver seeing a child crossing the road. Don't be pressured by bad weather into parking too close to the school - better a wet coat than a visit to A & E!

DO NOT PARK ON PAVEMENTS

Inconsiderate drivers who park their vehicles wholly or partially on the pavement not only cause danger - but also commit an offence of obstruction. They cause danger to pedestrians, especially children and mothers with prams and pushchairs. Pavements are not constructed to take the weight of vehicles. The local authority may make a claim against you for the damage caused to the footpath.

DO NOT OBSTRUCT

You only visit the school twice a day, so why ruin the quality of life of residents? Parking across or near driveways obstructs the views of those trying to manoeuvre in and out of them. It is also anti-social behaviour.
